Anchor and Sail

Anchor and Sail is a project to teach boatbuilding to the people of Glasgow, Scotland. It's the result of a partnership between The GalGael and the Clyde Maritime Trust in the heart of Glasgow.

The Project has been a response to the loss of key maritime heritage skills in Scotland along with the wider cultural loss that comes from the erosion of intangible cultural heritage. We have three main elements:



– Accredited apprentices in an 18 month programme. These people will receive high level training sufficient to allow them to work as boatbuilders in the future.

– Participants completing a 12 week voluntary programme of heritage engagement, learning traditional skills and aspects of maritime heritage.

– Community events throughout the year, celebrating milestones in each build as well as letting people know about the work that we are doing. Next big one is the first Clydebuilt Festival in September 2017, a celebration of Boats, Folk and Maritime Heritage.

Over three and a half years the project will build two new heritage vessels and restore two more. These boats will be built across both partner's workshops, with the two organisations working on project vessels that will allow them to offer more for the people of Glasgow in the future.
