

Cape Cod Maritime Museum

Cape Cod Maritime Museum_ is on a spectacular piece of land right on Barnstable Harbor. It features exhibits on boat building, shipwrecks and maritime artifacts. On display is the hull of the Sparrow-Hawk, which sank off Cape Cod in 1626, bringing settlers to the new colony.

The museum partners with local schools to promote and share the maritime experience. The featured exhibits change regularly. Information about the schedule is on the museum's informative website. It offers classes in boat design, half-model making, ship in a bottle making and boat building.

The museum offers sailboat rides on the Sarah, the museum-built replica of the 1886 Crosby catboat. The Sarah is slipped right at the museum site on the harbor.
