

Wind & Oar Boat School

Wind & Oar uses a curriculum informed by the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) and the Common Core Math Standards (CCMS) to engage and inspire students from grades 5-12. Working primarily during in-school hours, W&O partners with 6 school districts in the Portland, OR metro area by providing project oriented, experiential learning environments. Boat building programs run from 25 hours to 375 hours. Summer programs, also with partner youth organizations, run from one to four weeks, and have been typically held at the partner's site. With the recent move to a larger facility, Wind & Oar is gearing up to offer tuition based programs for adults and youth.
